

What is Mission Possible Mentor Training?

- Who is a mentor: Youth who have completed 8th grade as of June 15 who would like to serve alongside a Texas 4-H Center Counselor and Adult Volunteers to provide a safe and fun camp experience for all
- A minimum of (10) ten 4-H Mentors will be selected to assist with Mission Possible.
- 4-H Mentors reside in the dorms & participate in all camp activities. As a Mentor, they may be asked to work individually with a camper needing special attention or with the entire group. Mentors will shadow the 4-H Center Counselor and be available to assist in whatever capacity that is needed.

 To be considered as a 4-H Mentor, individuals must complete the online application.
- *In-Service Training: all selected to serve as mentors will be required to participate in an in-service training June 30th 10:00 a.m through July 1st 11:30 a.m. at the 4-H Center. There may also be information presented on-line before the camp, to help prepare mentors for their role.


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
